

What screeners will look for in the
Student PowerPoint Presentation
submitted for screening:

If you are selected at your school's science fair or by your teacher to be screened for entrance in the GSDSEF in Balboa Park, you will need to create a 10* slide PowerPoint presentation, explaining your project.

You will submit the PowerPoint Presentation to the Science Fair Screening Coordinator who will send it to an appropriate screener.

This PowerPoint will be due on your school's DEADLINE DATE (some time between Mid-January and Mid-February). These dates posted on the GSDSEF website SOON!

The 10 slide* PowerPoint presentation should give a screener an overview of your complete project.

Screeners will look for the following:

Title slide with the following information: Your name, grade, school, teacher name, project title, and your Proposed Category.

Abstract

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Hypothesis

Clearly defined Controls

Variables

Appropriate Measurements

Data charts & graphs, appropriately labeled

Conclusions

Bibliography

*You may include two additional slides if they are REALLY needed to help explain your project

AND remember:

Adequate Sample size; i.e.: a plant sciences project should have at least 30 (100 would be even better) plants per test group

Show the questions you asked in your "Survey"—if a survey is used

Your teacher will verify for us that you have submitted, to them, all relevant certification forms for your project-- **DO NOT** include these forms in your PowerPoint

After screening, your teacher will be notified ASAP as to whether you are accepted to apply to the GSDSEF and will give you instructions on how to complete the application process.
